OPEN POSITION

Hospitals & Institutions (H&I):

Old Business: Request was made to Area for Literature increase without subcommittee approval; from \$400 dollars to \$600 dollars. Our literature Rep requested increase to cover 3 additional new pamphlets for our youth facility, one of which has an individual cost of \$1.25 each. The 3 pamphlets would together cost an additional \$195. dollars to our current 400-dollar budget.

The committee voted and decided to keep the expensive pamphlets until they run out, but not to purchase additional refill at \$125 of "Behind the Wall" pamphlets.

Pamphlets also set for Youth meetings; "By Young Addicts for Young Addict s", "For Parents or Guardians of Young People in NA". The committee also voted to add, "Am I an Addict", "For Those in Treatment" and "Sponsorship" pamphlets.

- Meetings will begin at the Youth Study Center on Thursday June 6th, 2024. Nicole will serve as coordinator and panel leader until other people can be cleared. Speakers do not need clearance.
- Regent has committed to reimburse all cost used to get clearance for this facility.
- Belmont has put into discussion opening an additional meeting. Currently is just discussion until more details are determined.
- Voting was done by committee to change virtual meetings at HUP Cedar on Mondays to live in-person (approved).

Agenda Item: Decrease amount from 600 for Literature, back to 400, until increase is needed.
